Berkeley Facts



- #1 public university in the U.S.
- #5 in the world in reputation rankings (UK's *Times Higher Education*)
 - The Sweet Six include: Harvard, MIT, Cambridge, Stanford, Berkeley and Oxford
- 51 Nobel Prizes so far
- #1 in number of startup companies who received Venture Capital funding
- Berkeley IP licensees have commercialized 100 products and dozens more are in the R&D pipeline.
- 150+ start-up companies founded to commercialize Berkley IP
- 65 companies have raised an average of \$13.8M.

Industry at Berkeley

- More than 500 companies have sponsored research at Berkeley and/or joined an industry affiliates program since 2004
- Repeat business: ~40% of sponsoring companies sponsor research more than once





FUEGO as a Membership Program

- Membership Model
 - Berkeley to host public-private partnership
 - Many industry participants join
 - Membership Agreement
 - Annual fees fund research and operations
 - Involves multiple Berkeley researchers
- All members receive the same benefits
 - Same research program
 - Same IP rights
 - No company-specific project or budget
 - Same opportunity to influence program
 - However, program may have tiered benefits
- All agreements have the same terms
 - No specially negotiated terms for each member

FUEGO Membership Benefits

- Early IP access limited to "make and use"
- First Right to negotiate commercial IP license
- Early access to papers, research results
- Meetings, conferences on research and trends
- IAB membership to higher paying members
- Affiliation, networking
 - Meet with faculty, competitors, in pre-competitive framework
- Access to students as interns and new-hires
- Access to resources: libraries, software



FUEGO IP Access

- FUEGO IP is filed Berkeley Case # B11-081
- FUEGO Members have "make, use" rights
 - For internal evaluation, research
- FUEGO Members have an exclusive first right to negotiate separate commercial license





Confidentiality Agreements

- Prefer not to receive confidential information under FUEGO membership agreement.
- Exchange under separate company-Berkeley CDA
- Limited to preparing proposals, discussing new initiatives, such as in Industry Advisory Board meetings



Export Control

- Berkeley operates under the Fundamental Research Exemption (FRE)
- Berkeley does not wish to receive export controlled information or technology
- Berkeley does not reveal citizenship or keep foreign students from projects



Overseas Offsets



- Fire is global. Think Australia.
- FUEGO members may have offset obligations in selling to foreign countries.
- Obligation can be met by subcontracting.
- Berkeley has international collaborators.
- Berkeley can be an offset partner through FUEGO.
